year in review

2017 was another development year for Catapult. Our focus was on expanding programming to include our older alumni who are living on their own or transitioning from from post-secondary into the workplace. The goal is to inspire, inform and empower all of our alumni, wherever they are.

In November, we launched our first full day Alumni Conference. Our participants said the sessions were relevant topics that they had not been exposed to elsewhere. In March, we offered an income tax prep session from which they'll benefit for years to come. And in June, we offered a banking session for those who are starting to invest and apply for loans. Of course, our signature Camp and Plus Conference, held in August at Acadia University, continue to rate extremely well with IOO% of campers reporting a boost of confidence and 95% of Plus students stating they felt more confident in their post-secondary plans. Through relevant programming, we've propelled our students toward heights they may not have otherwise achieved. We are incredibly proud of their accomplishments, big and small, and especially impressed by how they are paying it forward and making positive impacts in their own community.

In January, our first fundraising event, "Illumination" was presented by Bloom Wealth. It was a sell-out and not only raised funds, but also provided some of our youth with volunteer and public speaking experiences. With several Catapult students sharing their stories, our stakeholders saw firsthand the impact their gifts have given to Nova Scotian youth.

We look toward 2018 with excitement as our program rolls into its 10th year. It's truly an honour to manage the programs your support makes possible. You've given us the opportunity to witness tremendous growth of now 450 young leaders across Nova Scotia. Over the coming year, we look forward to sharing how our students are learning more, doing more and giving back to their communities.

- We held our first full-day skills **Workshop for Alumni**. Hosted by Stantec at their state-of-the-art facility, our college aged alumni learned the important skills of networking, communication styles, interviewing, and money management.
- Grant Thornton hosted our very first income tax clinic where alumni received a tax tutorial and completed their income tax returns together using free online CRA software.
- Scotiabank hosted an alumni session on **investing and** loans.
- Kristof was named **NS Youth Volunteer of the Year**! Other youth volunteer awards were presented to Bailey (HRM), Cameron (Kings Co.) and Tyrell (Guysborough Co.)
- Taylor and Lauren were 2 of 30 students selected from across Canada as an EF **Canadian Youth Ambassador** (from 1300 applicants). They took part in the 100th anniversary commemorations of the Battle of Vimy Ridge, and were mentored by MPs and Senators during an Ottawa conference.
- Our very **first fundraising event** raised more than \$35,000! Planned and hosted by Bloom Wealth & Legacy Planning, 'Illumination' featured East Coast singer-songwriters at the Halifax Central Library. Stealing the show, four Catapult alumni bravely took the stage to share their experience and impact.
- Kayla and Kayley were selected for **RBC's #Make150Count** program and attended RBC's Youth Summit.
- Gracie was elected **President** of her **student council** bringing our impressive tally to 15!
- Riley was awarded the **Lieutenant Governor Award** for Leadership bringing our total tally to 19!

- We created a 1-year term position for a university aged alumni to sit on our **Board of Directors** to represent our students. This year, Tyler will also help plan the 2018 Alumni Workshop. We're continuing to invite a Catapult alum to each of our Board meetings. It's not only a great opportunity for them, but they add energy and effective feedback to our meetings.
- Kristof was awarded the Queen Elizabeth medal, the medal of the Governor General of Canada, and more than \$21,000 in **scholarships**.
- Mekayla '15 led our **Catapult team** in the Santa Shuffle, bringing together 7 catapulters from 5 different communities to raise money for the Salvation Army.
- Robyn and Zach, 2009 alumni were **Counselors** at Camp this year, while our Plus Conference included 4 alumni on staff.
- 2011 alum Kayla trained with Canadian Roots Exchange to lead **reconciliation workshops** with NS youth. The goal is to bridge the gap between indigenous and non-indigenous youth.
- Relations were strengthened and new connections made with **other youth organizations** including Hope Blooms, Schools Plus, Pathways, the MacPhee Centre, Junior Achievement, HRM Connections, and others.
- At conference, all students shared their '**pay forward projects**' some of which are shared on the back page. Not only are their presentations inspiring, but we are so impressed to see the growth in confidence with public speaking.
- 62 schools sent 89 nominations despite the **work-tocontract mandate**. This demonstrates their support and belief in our program.

Our Signature Camp

7 days at Acadia, the focus is on accelerating leadership potential by boosting confidence and preparing them to start high school as active leaders. Students must be nominated by a Grade 9 teacher. Average age is 15.

Career Coaching

Guided by our videos and handbook, our students are matched with a mentor to help choose a career direction and plan post secondary education.


PLUS Conference

4 days at Acadia for high school alumni, the focus is post secondary planning and life skills. Students must earn their way to conference through extra-curricular involvement, creating a personal mission statement, setting goals, and paying it forward with community service.

Student Support
